## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING COMMON COUNCIL & RENSSELAER UTILITY BOARD July 22, 2024

The Common Council of the City of Rensselaer and Rensselaer Utility Board met on July 22, 2024 in regular session in Council Chambers of City Hall. Mayor Jeffrey S. Phillips called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. followed by an invocation offered by Kenin Smith and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Answering roll call were: Mayor Jeff Phillips; Clerk-Treasurer Shelby Keys; Council Members Russ Overton, Kevin Armold, Noelle Weishaar, Jeff Rayburn, Ernest Watson, Jr; City Attorney Todd Sammons; Building Commissioner Josh Davis, Park Supt. and Interim Cemetery Caretaker Joe Effinger; Police Chief Matt Anderson, Utility Office Manager Heather Smart, Street/Water/Sewer/Sanitation Supt. Bryce Black, Project Coordinator Jerry Lockridge, and Gas Supt. Carol Lockridge. Fire Chief Kenny Haun and Lead Line Foreman Garrett Welker were absent.

Also in attendance were: Bob Schenk with Rensselaer Adventures, Tony Schotanus, Stace Pickering, and Cody Heldak.

The minutes of the July 8, 2024 regular council meeting were presented There was a motion by Rayburn, second by Weishaar, to approve the minutes as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments and Petitions: None.

**Resolution 18-2024, Transfer of Funds:** Keys read a transfer of funds within the General Fund for \$3,500.00 and MVH for \$5,500.00. There was a motion by Weishaar, second by Watson, to approve the resolution. The motion passed unanimously.

**Burial Rights Request:** Keys read burial rights request for Christian and Trissa Arihood. There was a motion by Overton, second by Watson, to approve the request. The motion passed unanimously.

Consideration of Bids: Black received two quotes for the replacement of a recycling truck. The quote from Jim Dobson Ford for \$68,680.84 and from Gutwein Motors for \$62,649.00. Black said the truck they are replacing will be used by the Street Department and there are funds available for this purchase in the recycling grant fund. Armold asked if Black will get rid of a truck. Black said it will probably be an interdepartmental transfer. There was a motion by Rayburn, second by Armold, to accept the bid from Gutwein Motors. The motion passed unanimously.

**Credit Card Statement:** Phillips asked for council's permission to sign the credit card activity log. There was a motion by Watson, second by Rayburn, to allow Phillips to sign the activity log. The motion passed unanimously.
